

## **Edward J. Schumacher**

Edward Schumacher is an Associate professor of economics at Trinity University and holds appointments in the departments of Health Care Administration and Economics. He has more than sixteen years of experience teaching health economics, microeconomics, and quantitative methods.

Since coming to Trinity University in 2002, Dr. Schumacher has taught the health economics courses and quantitative methods sequence at the graduate level as well as undergraduate health economics. He has also provided leadership to the department in redesigning their curriculum to meet the changing needs of the health management field

Dr. Schumacher's research interests are in the areas of health care labor markets, empirical analysis of unions, monopsony power, earnings imputation, and behavioral health economics. He has published more than twenty peer reviewed articles in leading health and labor economics journals including *The Journal of Health Economics*, *Journal of Labor Economics*, *Journal of Human Resources*, *Social Science and Medicine*, and *Industrial and Labor Relations Review*.

Dr. Schumacher received his Ph.D. in economics from Florida State University; and M.A. and B.A. from the University of North Carolina, Greensboro. He is a member of The American Society of Health Economists, The American Economic Association, The Society of Labor Economists, and The Southern Economic Association.
